

SCOPE OF WORK

This project involves the replacement of aging underground utilities to improve the infrastructure in Covington's downtown square. The work will include:

- Removal of old materials and installation of new sewer, water, and gas lines.
- Installation of new power and telecommunication duct bank.
- Removal and replacement of asphalt and street striping.

UTILITY IMPROVEMENTS & BENEFITS

The downtown square utility relocation project will bring lasting advantages to local merchants by enhancing reliability, safety, and growth potential. By updating outdated utilities and improving public spaces, downtown Covington will be better equipped to support businesses and attract more visitors.

- RELIABLE SERVICES: Modern utilities will reduce the risk of outages and service disruptions, ensuring smooth business operations.
- BUSINESS GROWTH POTENTIAL:
 These improvements will boost property values, attract new businesses, and foster a safer, more vibrant downtown.

The Downtown Square Relocation & Replacement Project will focus on upgrading aging infrastructure within a 9-block perimeter of the square.

PROJECT TIMELINE


The project is expected to be completed in 360 days. Stay tuned for updates on key milestones.
