WHAT ARE MINIMUM BASIC OPERATIONS?



Governor Kemp issued an executive order that gyms, fitness centers, bowling alleys, body art studios, barbers, cosmetologists, hair designers, nail care artists, estheticians, their respective schools and massage therapists may reopen their doors on Friday, April 24, 2020. These businesses must follow minimum basic operation requirements & practice social distancing and regular sanitation protocols.



EVALUATE & SCREEN WORKERS who exhibit signs of illness, such as a fever over 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, cough or shortness of breath



11 DELIVER INTANGIBLE SERVICES remotely when possible



2 STAY HOME IF YOU'RE SICK which means requiring workers who exhibit signs of illness to not report to work and/or to seek medical attention



12 DISCOURAGE SHARED USE of workers' phones, desks, offices or other work tools and equipment



IMPROVE SANITATION MEASURES in the workplace as appropriate



PROHIBIT HANDSHAKING and other unnecessary person-to-person contact in the workplace



REQUIRE HANDWASHINGor sanitation by workers at appropriate places within the business location



POST HAND HYGIENE REMINDERS throughout the workplace and in other workplace areas where they are likely to be seen



PROVIDE PPE
(personal protective equipment) as available and appropriate to the function and location of the worker within the business location



and PIN entry devices, electronic signature capture and any other shared devices that require touching by multiple people



PROHIBIT WORK GATHERINGS or group gatherings in the workplace during work hours



entrology of non-cohabitating persons while present on such entity's leased or owned property



or breaks outside, in their office or personal workspace or in such other areas where proper social distancing is attainable



PROVIDE ALTERNATIVE POINTS OF SALE like outside buildings, curbside pickup or delivery of products and/or services if an alternative point of sale is permitted under Georgia law



IMPLEMENT TELEWORKING for all possible workers



INCREASE PERSONAL PHYSICAL SPACE between workers and customers



IMPLEMENT STAGGERED SHIFTS for all possible workers



PROVIDE DISINFECTANT FOR WORKERS and sanitation products to clean their workspace, equipment and tools



HOLD ALL MEETINGS VIRTUALLY when possible



INCREASE SPACE BETWEEN WORKERS worksites to at least six (6) feet

Although businesses are being allowed to reopen, it's not "business as usual." COVID-19 is still a threat so please continue to practice social distancing, wash your hands, refrain from touching your face and wear a cloth mask when you are out in public.
